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EMP 852: The Art of Healing: Research Practice (3 Credits)

Overview of Course:

Students will explore the interrelationships between a variety of healing modalities and the creative response within those who perform healings and those who receive them.

Course Topics:

- I. Overview of many alternative modalities including ENERGETIC, INTUITIVE, SPIRITUAL HEALING, and PRAYER. In-person and distant healing techniques will be discussed in detail.
- II. Introduction to the role of HEALING in CREATIVITY through what the instructor calls THE CREATIVITY RESPONSE will be explored as a central theme of this course.

Learning Objectives:

- Students will learn about a wide spectrum of healing modalities often included in energy medicine and spiritual healing.
- Students will become familiar with practices of healer preparation and training for various approaches and healing delivery protocols.
- Students will study practical examples of how giving and receiving healing is linked to heightened creativity in the lives of healers and intuitives, both contemporary and historical.

Audience:

Open to all students in the Doctorate program.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

The course of study will explore the premise that healing is an art, not a science. Numerous examples will be cited of practitioners and recipients of energetic and spiritual healing who have enhanced creativity. The interrelationship of healer training and delivery protocols to stimulation of the *creative response* within both the healer and recipient will be examined.

NEED STATEMENT

Students will:

 Deepen their understanding of energetic, intuitive, and spiritual healing modalities including, but not limited to the following: energetic balancing, medical intuition, dream work, shamanic healing, psychic surgery, healing with channeled guides and spirit helpers, healing through objects and talismans, prayer through in-person laying-on-ofhands and at a distance.

- 2) Appreciate how many forms of creativity are linked to healing including, but not limited to the following: writing poetry and prose, music, dance, performance, and visual arts.
- 3) Gain deeper appreciation of the role of creativity in healing at all levels.
- 4) Learn how a desire to heal or to receive healing may be related to a need for creative self-expression.
- 5) Come to recognize common blocks to creativity and how to heal or move through them, and thus become more effective at healing self and others.

FACULTY-STUDENT COMMUNICATION

Telephone Contacts:

It is important that students arrange by email beforehand for all telephone communications. Periodic telephone interactions, as required, at the student's expense, can most easily be arranged through email contact.

Communications:

It is requested that the students stay in weekly correspondence with the instructor using email. Check your email frequently for messages. The student should also set up monthly telephone conversations, at their expense, to discuss problems, concerns, or determine the direction of their course work. Students are always encouraged to contact the instructor by e-mail, fax, or telephone whenever a major concern may arise. It should be understood that as mature students, it is the responsibility of the students to stay in contact with their instructors. The instructor is also willing to set up one-on-one discussions with the student via audio & video Internet exchange using a variety of Net options.

Students will normally send communications via email and submit reports and other paperwork as MSWORD format files attached to emails. Fax or US mail transmission may be used, at the direction of and with the approval of the instructor.

Synchronous Internet sessions will be used for 'chat sessions'. In this case, students are asked to download and use Yahoo Messenger Chat and Voice Chat.

COURSE DELIVERY STYLE

Distance Education - Coursework is completed at a location determined by the student utilizing a computer that has the ability to play audio and video clips, with Microsoft Office Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Adobe Reader, along with a current web browser, internet connection and email address. Contact and communication with distance students is typically conducted by telephone, Internet, Skype, text chat, and email. Students are also encouraged to contact the University by facsimiles, and postal mail, and by personal visit to the University.

All lessons, coursework and papers must be copied to lessons@energymedineuniversity.org from both the student and professor.

1.) Reading Assignments

Students will be assigned reading in the course text and additional reference materials, as listed.

2.) Audio Materials

Listening assignments will be made from the audio portion of the course, as available.

3.) Threaded Discussions

Some of the course dialogue will be on the Internet in a 'threaded discussion' page that will maintain an on-going discussion among the students and faculty for the entire semester. It may be assessed anytime. The thread page is located at: http://groups, yahoo.com/group/Energy_Medicine.

4.) Course Papers/Projects

Students will conduct research based on primary and secondary source materials and the required text and other materials provided by the instructor. From this research, students will write papers of the assigned length to be submitted as typed, double-spaced (on topics approved by the instructor).

5.) A class forum, consisting of a one-and-one-half hour chat meeting on line, will be held several times during the semester. This will take place at a time arranged by the instructor to accommodate as many of the students as is possible. Please note in the schedule when written materials are to be submitted either prior or within a specified time period after the session. Students are asked to download and use Yahoo Messenger Chat.

6.) Essay Examination

Students are issued a set of topic assignments, readings and explorations, in preparation for an oral examination of the materials. Before the deadline, students schedule with the instructor the time and date for the face-to-face, telephone, or Yahoo Messenger Voice Chat or SKYPE conference. During the examination, the instructor will make notations of the effectiveness, qualities, and weaknesses of the student's replies.

7.) Additional Note

When enrollment is limited to one student this class will be conducted as Mentorship. The instructor reserves the right to include an additional Mid-Term examination which will be fully announced and explained at the beginning of the semester when the class is delivered in a Mentorship format. When delivered as Mentorship to a single student online participation may be modified by the instructor to maximize the learning experience.

COURSE ASSIGNMENTS

Required reading assignments refer to the text for the course, Randall-May, Cay 2009 *Healing and the Creative Response*. CayMay Press, Phoenix, Arizona. Auditory assignments refer to the accompanying CD by the same title.

Assignment #1: What is Healing?

Participate in the first online voice enabled forum, or in an alternative group discussion as facilitated by the instructor, in which the class and the techniques for online interaction will be introduced.

(Read pgs.... in the text and the discussion of What is Healing on the following web site: <u>www.CouncilforHealing.org</u>) Write a four-page, double-spaced typed discussion in which you define energetic and spiritual healing. If you are a healing practitioner, or would like to become one, please indicate if your healing modality fits into either or both of these definitions. Why? If you have received energetic or spiritual healing treatment please describe your experience. Did the treatment you received fit into the definitions of energetic and/or spiritual healing? Why?

Assignment #2: **Exploration of Alternative Healing Methods. Energetic Healing.** (Read pgs..... in the text.) Identify three alternative healing modalities which use energetic healing. Interview two practitioners of these methods to find out how they were trained or certified in their particular healing method. Ask if they have a creative outlet, such as writing, painting, music, etc., in addition to their healing practice. Do they feel that their creativity has been enhanced by their healing training or experiences? Compile the responses in a 3-page double-spaced typed report.

Enter into the Threaded Discussion page of the class web site. To the extent that is practical, share online with other students in the class which alternative healing modalities your practitioners use. The instructor will assist you, as time and opportunity permit, to pick modalities which complement, not duplicate, what other students are using. Note this may not be easily determined or may be difficult to do, but will provide as much variety in the class experience as possible.

Assignment #3: **Exploration of Alternative Healing Methods. Spiritual Healing.** (Read pgs.... in the text) Identify three alternative healing modalities which use a spiritual approach to healing. Interview two practitioners of these methods to find out how they were trained or certified to do their healing work. In addition to their healing practice, do they have a creative outlet, such as writing, painting, music, etc.? Do they feel that their healing practice inspires or otherwise supports their creativity?

Post your responses to assignment #2 and #3 on the Discussion Page of the course Internet site at least three days (72 hours) prior to the second online session. One or two days (24 to 48 hours) before the session comment briefly on each person's posting. Between 24 and two hours before the session respond briefly to at least half the comments on your own responses.

Assignment #4: Healing As Transformative Experience.

(Read pgs...in the text) In a 3-page double spaced paper describe a healing crisis, period of grieving due to personal loss, or other stressful time in your life or in the life of someone else. Did you, or the person you are writing about, receive benefit during this time from an energetic or spiritual healing modality? What creative outlets did you, or the person you are writing about, find most helpful during this time? In what way(s) might that experience have changed you or the person about whom you are writing?

Submit your responses to the instructor and post them to the Discussion Page of the course website according to the **Course Completion Timetable**. Post brief (up to 75 words or ¹/₄ double-spaced, typed page) comments about each of the other student's reports.

Assignment #5: The Creative Response

(Read pgs. ... in the text) Make a list of at least 5 ways in which going through a healing crisis and/or training to be a healer might stimulate the *Creative Response* as described by the instructor in class and in your assigned reading. In a 3-page paper expand upon what it means to be 'in the zone', that unique state of awareness where intuitive and innovative thinking predominate. Compare and contrast between being 'in the zone' during healing (receiving or facilitating for another person) and being 'in the zone' during a creative activity, such as writing, singing, dancing, painting, etc. Describe any blocks to creativity which you presently experience or may have experienced in the past. How might training as a healer benefit you in moving through these creative challenges?

Assignment #6: Final paper:

Prepare a scholarly paper of approximately 20 double spaced typewritten pages. Papers will focus upon a specific aspect of healing and creativity. Topic of the paper will be determined by the instructor in consultation with the student in order to optimize the learning potential to the student. Grades will be given on content, and use of source material, also grammar, spelling, and originality. Students should use the American Psychological Association Style Manual. Students may also have the option of designing a research project.

Assignment #7: Final Essay Examination

The final examination will be given by telephone conference (or other means) and will cover the reading assignments. Students will negotiate the timing of the examination. The Essay Examination will be consistent with and will reflect EMU's Doctoral level focus on a balance of theory and research. The instructor will provide sample questions for discussion purposes at least two weeks before the test is administered. The student is responsible for setting the time, date, and means of communication preferred for this test by Week 8 of the semester. These particulars will be confirmed by the instructor. The Essay Examination will have both written and oral questions which will be provided to the student in a timely way by the instructor.

INDIVIDUALIZATION OF STUDENT ASSIGNMENTS

Each research or creative assignment or written paper will be chosen by the student, under the guidance of the instructor, to best support the student's individual professional goals. Each student will also benefit from seeing the fruits of all fellow students' research and creative projects and by providing professional criticism of each others' work.

Each student will be afforded the opportunity of writing on subjects that are related to his or her field of interest. This will assist the student in making each paper individualized. Also the student is encouraged to go outside the field and obtain research data from other interdisciplinary areas. Each student, based on his or her background, will be encouraged to transfer that generalized and theoretical information which the course provides into practical application in the individualized summarizing assignment.

COURSE EVALUATION

Grades are based on the following elements of a student's participation and accomplishment. In determining a grade for this course, the following formula will be used:
